



- Increased growth in areas recently affected by wildfire



Since 2017, Santa Clara & Santa Cruz Counties have
 >12 Firewise communities. In 2020, 8 are in process.





- •Individual responsibility

Steps to Achieving National Recognition

- Form a board/ steering committee comprised of neighborhood residents and other wildfire stakeholders
- Obtain a wildfire risk assessment from the Fire Department with your jurisdiction or designated representative
- •Host a minimum of one wildfire risk reduction educational outreach event, or related activity per year



Steps to Achieving National Recognition

 Develop a multi-year action plan based on the site's risk reduction priorities and community assessment

- •Meet the minimum wildfire risk reduction investment-1 hour per residence per year (2020 equivalent=\$35)
- Create a Firewise USA® Portal account and submit an application to your state Firewise USA liaison


